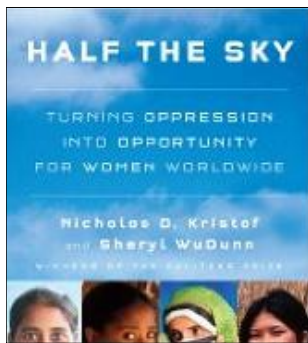

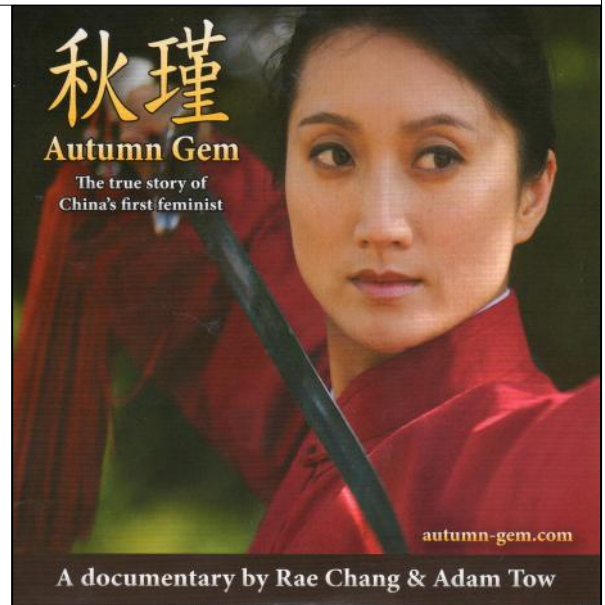
### Coming Up . . .
